> only Pack 49 scouts and their parent(s)/guardian(s) may participate.

> Scouts do not need to be accompanied by their parent/guardian as long as  
> we have a sufficient number of adults to scouts.

> Cost for any Pack 49 scout is free (due to our success raising funds from  
> the popcorn sale).

> Parent(s)/guardian(s) wishing to come along are \$60 per person.  
>  
> All meals are included in the fee that the USS Hornet charges us.  
>  
> If you want to sign up, please sign up your scout and bring a check to pay  
> for any parent(s)/guardian(s) also attending. Checks should be made out to  
> "BSA Pack 49".

> We do have a limit on the number of participants (45) so I encourage any  
> of you with interest in participating to sign up in January.

Hello,

As a reminder, we will start the sign up process for participating on the USS Hornet overnight trip at the next pack meeting which is scheduled for NEXT TUESDAY January 9.

I have had a number of people contact me about signing up by email. Sign ups will not start until the pack meeting to be fair to everyone wanting to attend - even though scouts will be able to attend for FREE. (Note: ONLY adults bringing checks will be able to sign up. We are unable to take sign ups for any adult participants unless they bring a check.)

Also -- I have been informed by the USS Hornet that they will require any scout under the age of 9 to be accompanied by an adult. For those of you wishing to have your scout under age 9 participate, please make sure that a parent or guardian can accompany them. We cannot sign up a scout under age 9 without an accompanying (and paying) adult.

Again, all scouts will be free to participate. Any adults going along will be \$60 each.

We have been unable to confirm room for more than the 45 spots we originally booked so please come ready to sign up and provide checks at next week's den meeting. So sign ups will be first come, first serve at the January pack meeting.

Hello,

Our overnight stay on the US Hornet is coming up on Saturday March 17. We are to board the ship at approx 4 pm.

We have 45 people going (25 scouts and 20 adults). We are sold out for the space we had reserved.

Attached are a couple of information items about the program, safety tips, itinerary, and a map with driving directions.

We are encouraged to organize car pools for our group. We also have a number of older scouts coming without a parent so we must get some folks to agree to take some scouts in their cars. However, as a requirement of the Boy Scouts for our liability insurance, we must have information about any driver, their car, and their insurance coverage IN ADVANCE if they plan to take other scouts or adults in their car as part of this event. If we don't have this information in advance and filed with our tour permit, you may not take another scout or adult in your car without violating our liability insurance req'ts.

At this point, I need two things from those of you going:

1) Please confirm back to me on email that you still plan to attend. This will help assure that I have your email correct for future information that will be sent out.

2) If you are able to drive other families/scouts, please let me know by February 4 so that I can complete our required Tour Permit. Please send to me your name, car kind/make/year, name of owner of vehicle, number of people you can take (incl driver), your driver's license number/state, and your insurance coverage \$ amounts (liability each person, each accident, and property damage).

Thanks again for your interest in this trip. It should be a lot of fun for the scouts (and the adults coming along, too).
